

## TEST TOPICS FOR UNA STUDENTS OF THE 2<sup>nd</sup> YEAR

### A. Put the verbs in brackets into *the bare infinitive* or *the present participle*:

1. The assistant saw the woman . . . (put) the necklace in her bag and . . . (leave).
2. We spent three weeks . . . (decorate) the house before we could move in.
3. He heard the clock . . . (strike) one before he went to bed.
4. My son enjoys going to the airport to watch the planes . . . (take off) and . . . (land).
5. I'll be busy . . . (clean) the house at the weekend.

### B. Consider the following fragment:

At that time, the good side of my character was stronger than the evil side. Henry Jekyll had his faults, but he was mostly a good, kind man. [ . . . ] Nobody could meet Edward Hyde without a feeling of dislike and horror. I believe I understand the reason for this too. *Everyone is a mixture of good and evil.*
